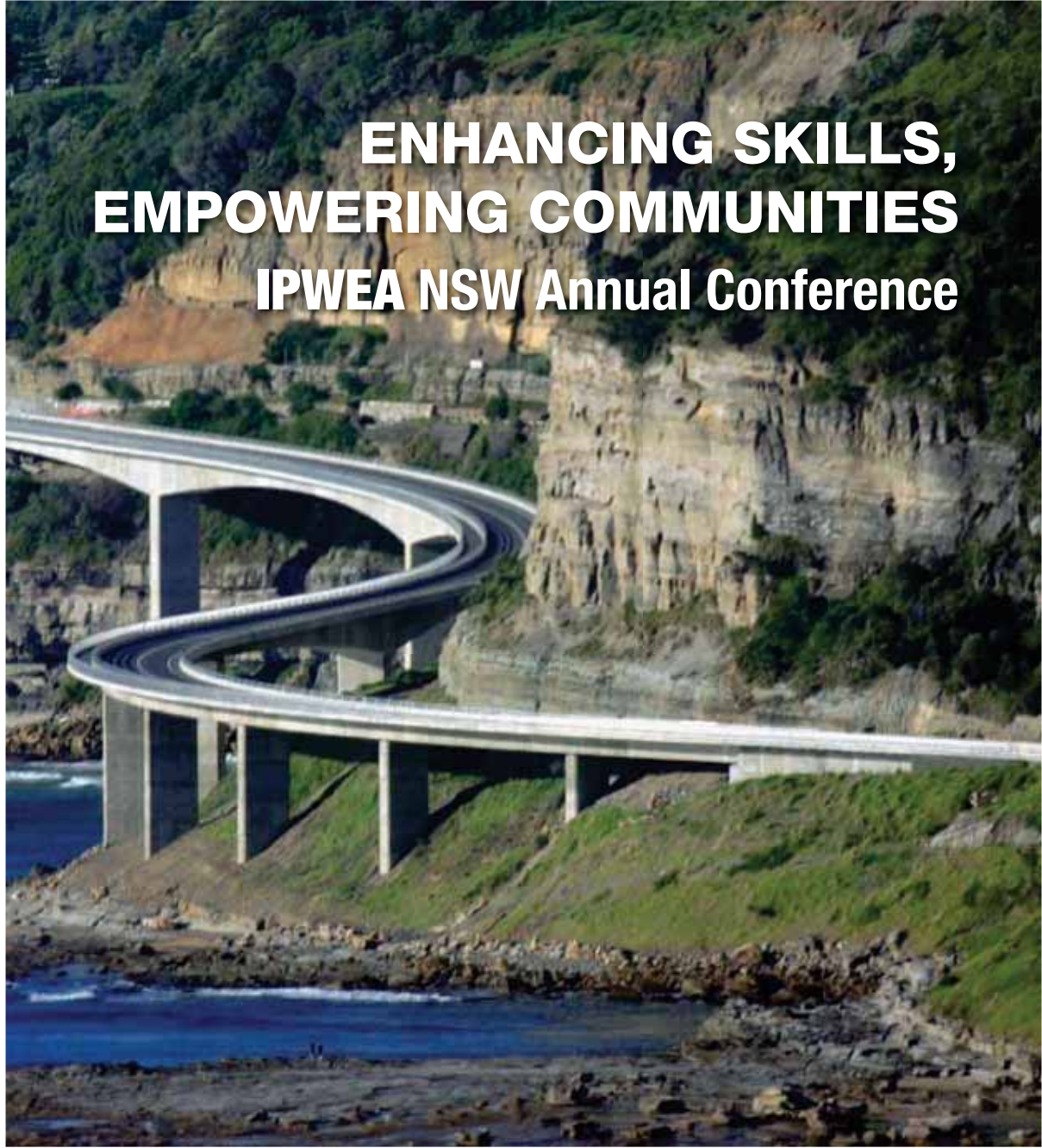

The Hon. David Campbell MP, Minister for Transport and Roads

We are delighted that Minister Campbell will open the Congress and address our delegates on the important issues of Regional transport planning, Road Safety issues, Road and Transport Funding and Higher Mass Limit (HML) vehicles. Joining the Parliament in March 1999, the Minister has held several portfolios including; Police, Regional Development, Small Business and Water Utilities. He is the Member for Keira, located within Illawarra Statistical Agricultural Subdivision.



He is Adjunct Professor of Intergenerational Strategies at the University of Queensland and a Fellow of the Australian College of Educators, the Environment Institute of Australia and New Zealand and the Australian Institute of Management. He is an elected Member of the International Union of Associations, based in Brussels, which has 45,000 international NGO members. He is also a Director of Green Cross Australia.

He has been a Senior Adviser to the United Nations system for more than 30 years including to the 1992 Earth Summit where he was a senior advisor on both the climate change and the biodiversity conventions. In this he was the only Australian and one of only 20 globally. At other times he has been a senior consultant to the UNEP, UNDP and UNESCO.

Dr Ellyard is an enlightening, challenging, thought-provoking and inspirational speaker.

Dr Peter Ellyard is a futurist, strategist and a leading international conference speaker. He is a graduate of Sydney University (BSc.Agr) and of Cornell University (MS, Ph.D).



Peter is currently Chairman of the Preferred Futures Institute and the Preferred Futures Group, which he founded in 1991. He also Chairs the Sustainable Prosperity Foundation.

Dr Ellyard is a highly experienced executive. He is the former Executive Director for the Australian Commission for the Future. He held CEO positions in a number of public sector organisations over 15 years including two associated with Environment and Planning, and one with Industry and Technology. He was also Chief of Staff of an Environment Minister in Canberra for 3 years.

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Welcome to the 2010 NSW Local Roads Congress

The Communiqué adopted at the 2009 Congress has provided the foundation for significant action in the past year. The Communiqué was considered at the 2009 Shires Conference where it gained support for referral to the 2009 National Local Roads Congress. In addition, the Local Government and Shires Associations engaged the Roads & Transport Directorate to develop a roads funding information package that can be used by the Associations in their approaches to both State and Federal Members of Parliament.

The Local Roads Congress is a major activity of the Roads & Transport Directorate which is a joint undertaking between the Local Government and Shires Associations of NSW and IPWEA (NSW). Holding the event in Wollongong this year should provide an opportunity for metropolitan delegates to attend and to stay for the Awards Dinner and the Conference.

The Hon. David Campbell, MP, NSW Minister for Transport and Roads will be addressing delegates and opening the Congress. This is your opportunity to gain an insight into the State Government's

thinking in relation to both roads and transport.

This year's Congress theme is "National Transport, Local Infrastructure" which is aimed particularly at the effect of national transport initiatives on local infrastructure. The Congress agenda includes a presentation by Professor Harry Clarke from La Trobe University titled *Reform of Taxes Related to Roads and Transport* which will be of particular interest to Local Government in NSW. Discussion at the Congress will also include the need for more efficient transport, the effect of higher mass limits (HML) on local roads, the need for increased funding from new funding models and a need for local communities to be involved in planning for transport routes on a regional basis. The Congress will include a session dealing with the new integrated planning and reporting environment with an assessment of how the development of infrastructure asset management plans is progressing.

The purpose of the Congress is to engage Elected Representatives and Senior Staff in the discussion of current road and transport issues and to raise

matters of local concern so that the Roads & Transport Directorate can carry out research and suggest solutions to common problems across the Local Government Industry.

The Congress provides a unique, open forum for Elected Representatives, General Managers and Asset Managers to exchange views and develop strong relationships which will progress Local Government.

I look forward to meeting you at the 2010 NSW Local Roads Congress.

IPWEA (NSW) Road Safety Officer Forum

For 2010 the Road Safety Officer Forum is taking a broader view of the issues of road safety in local government.

We are again bringing together the Roads Congress and Road Safety Officer Forum for the first part of the day as the NSW Minister for Transport and Roads, The Hon. David Campbell, delivers an opening address relevant to both workshops.

This year, after the official opening, the Forum will take on a theme of looking at how other states have adapted road safety into local government by examining some well established programs.

Many in local government believe the work of RSOs is extremely valuable and that they should be steering the future direction of how road safety becomes a part of local government thinking.

To this end, the speakers for this year's program all have extensive experience in the management of road safety in local government and it is hoped their input will inspire RSOs to drive their own role in NSW.

The interstate speakers will be Jason Deller *Principal, Strategic Transport Planning, Sunshine Coast Regional Council*, Sharon Wishart, *Community Programs Coordinator, VicRoads, Road Safety and Network Access*, and Ruth Wernham, *Safe System Coordinator, WALGA*. These speakers bring a tremendous amount of social capital and passion to the issue of embedding road safety into local government and will no doubt inspire Road Safety Officers with their fresh perspectives.

Our Road Safety Manager, Paul Riley, has been working on a project with the Ambulance Service of NSW investigating the costs of crashes and how these can be utilised by councils as a risk

management tool and to aid in identifying and reducing the instances of crashes for councils. The development of this project so far will be presented.

As always, the day would not be complete without RSOs having their say and this year two Road Safety Officers, Karen Thompson and Len Woodman, will present on projects which will interest all and hopefully encourage implementation of their projects across other councils.

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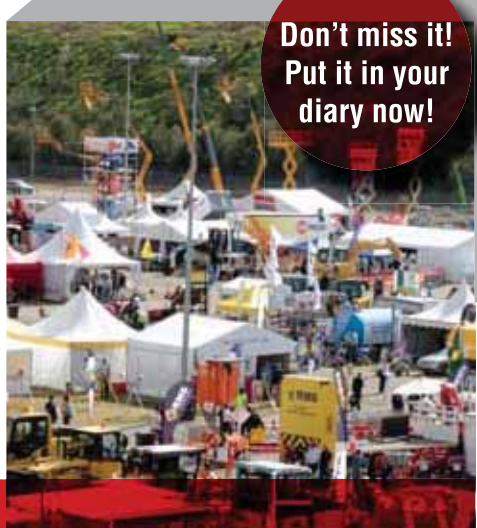
